
**GENE ROONEY**


CEIN DALY

## MIKE FINN BIOGRAPHY



Mike Finn is a playwright, screenwriter and actor who holds an MA in Scriptwriting from the National Film School and has had over fifty scripts produced in various media. Among his plays are *Pigtown* (winner of the Stewart Parker Award and produced Off-Broadway), *The Quiet Moment, The Crunch*, and *Shock & Awe*, (Island Theatre Co.). *Ellis Island* (Theatre USF, Florida). *Stories* (LYT). *Langered and One* (Balor Theatre Co.). *The Big Question* (Institute of Excitement, Hampstead Theatre, London), *We Are What We Witness, The Revenger's Tragedy and Porkville* (Bottom Dog) and *Life In 2 Syllables* (Fishamble, seen in Dublin, New York and Washington and described by The Guardian as "ingeniously written"). Mike also wrote the book for the musical *The Unlucky Cabin Boy* (Guna Nua) and co-wrote *On The Wire* nominated for a 'Best Production' Irish Times Theatre Award in 2014. In April 2019 Mike's play about the Limerick Soviet, *Bread Not Profits* had a sold out run in Limerick, receiving a five star review from the Irish Times and winning the Audience Choice Award at the Irish Times Irish Theatre Awards. *Wreckquiem*, a play about the down side of urban development was shortlisted for Fishamble's A Play For Ireland Award in 2019. For television, Mike has co-written extensively with Pat Shortt including thirty six episodes of the IFTA nominated *Killina-skully*, seven episodes of *Mattie* and the pilot of *Behind The Crystal Ball*. Mike wrote the radio drama *It's A Worthless Life* for RTE 1 and *Little Bits Left Over* for Limerick 95FM. In 2017, Mike was Theatre Artist-in-residence at the Belltable in limerick. In 2000, Mike represented Ireland at the prestigious International Writing Program at the University Of Iowa and returned the following year to be that university's International writer-in-resident. In 2002 he was the Burdine's Distinguished Artist-in-residence at the University Of South Florida.
